As part of our ongoing commitment to T Level delivery. University Academy Holbeach is pleased to announce the opening of our brand-new T Level Construction building. This exciting on-site development houses an impressive and extensive construction area which will accommodate all the Construction Department's multiple discipline requirements.



The intention is that the facility will be multi-functional: brickwork and joinery/carpentry students will build the shell of a domestic property in the teaching area, and then the electrical and plumbing students will practice their skills by the installation of gas pipework, water systems and electrical wiring. The opportunity this will afford our current and future cohorts is significant as they will gain real-time working knowledge of their area of expertise, and will also acquire an appreciation of what other skills go into a house build. In addition to the remarkable working area, the building also accommodates a specialised classroom facility, changing and shower area and an office for teaching staff to work.
