Health and Social Care Trip to Careers Fayre

Health & Social Care took pupils from Year 10 & 12 to The Engine Shed in Lincoln for an annual Health Careers Fayre. The Fayre featured lots of healthcare provisions which the pupils were able to explore. The students also had the opportunity to attend a midwifery and medicine seminar, which explored the wealth of opportunities on offer within the health sector.

Pupils participated in practical activities, including CPR, operating breathing resources and exploring how the electrical machinery works within health (heart rate machinery).

Students demonstrated exceptional behaviour throughout the day and it was really rewarding for everyone involved.







Young Carers at UAH

A Young Carer can be defined as:

A person under 18, who provides regular emotional or practical support to a family member or friend who is ill, disabled, or has a long-term health condition, mental health problem or drug or alcohol problem.

Being a Young Carer can have a big impact on things that are important to growing up, including managing school work and being able to socialise with peers.

It is important for us to identify and keep a record of all the Young Carers in school. We can provide a range of different supports for them and we are also able to signpost to other information and guidance provisions for them. Miss Graper is the Young Carer Lead in school and is available to work with all Young Carers, should they require support.




