Principal's Weekly Update

Dear Parent/Carer,

Firstly, my congratulations go to the pupils who attended the Badminton tournament at William Lovell this week. In all, 20 pupils from Years 8, 9 and 10 took part playing singles and doubles matches and County players. Although there were no individual winners, the pupils gained much experience and knowledge that will serve them in future GCSE studies. Many thanks to Mr Kirtland and Mrs Booth for facilitating the trip.

Our Careers focus this week has been on Unifrog, with pupils completing the Future Skills questionnaires. To support them in understanding their skills, qualities and future pathways, pupils have completed their skills profile and personality quizzes. The survey outcomes will be used to evaluate and tailor our Careers Programme to suit the needs of our learners.

Year 11 study revision sessions have taken place for Tutor Groups E and F. Mr Williams continues to guide pupils on revision strategies and planning for the GCSE examinations. On Tuesday, pupils were also provided with their mock examination results and were able to review their outcomes versus their target grades. These are available to view on Edulink One. Silence


Beds empty, shoes not worn





Department News – 6th Form


Over the past week, our Level 3 students have been preparing for their upcoming mock examinations, which are scheduled for next week.


